Lake Stevens Fire has three fire stations, an administration office, and a training facility located in Machias.

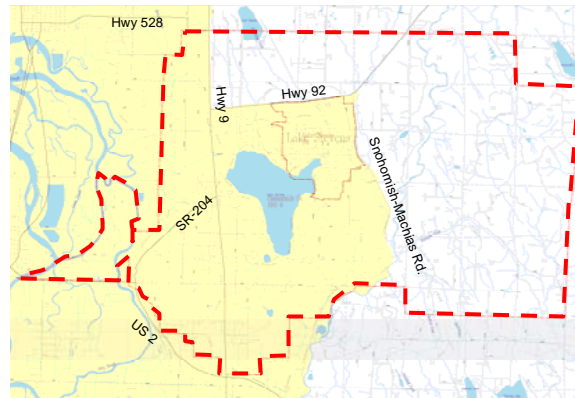
In 2005, Lake Stevens Fire responded to over 4,000 incidents. The majority of our calls were classified as medical.
